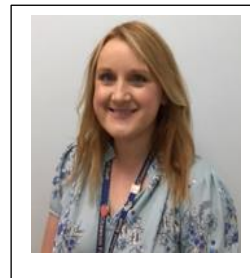

Providing help early to our pupils and families at Chawson First School means we can change a child's developmental path and improve outcomes for children, families, and communities, by providing support as soon as a problem emerges, at any point in a child's life, from the foundation years through to teenage year. Early help is more effective in promoting the welfare of children than reacting later.

We use a graduated approach to make sure we provide the best support for each family based on their individual situations. In order to support in the right way, we work with you to identify, what you are worried about, what is working well and what needs to happen to make life better. We will use the information you share with us to form a 'family plan', this will help us to easily identify how we as a school can support and if necessary, which other agencies and professionals that are able to offer further support in other areas.

'Open Door' attitude

You are welcome to come and talk to staff who will make you feel comfortable, at a time that is convenient to you through:

- Monthly drop in sessions.
- Booked appointment.
- Before or after school.
- Parents evening appointments.



What else do we provide?

- Soft start with doors opening from 8:30 and closing at 8:40.
- Safe school environment.
- Engaging curriculum where children receive enrichment opportunities and are challenged to achieve their best to become independent, articulate, aspirational children.
- Preschool and Early Years provision.
- Time to talk to trusted adults.
- Rewards for positive behaviour both in lessons and around school including weekly celebration assemblies and 'Always Child' each half term.
- Additional intervention and support for children eligible for Pupil Premium free



Safeguarding

- All staff are trained annually and provided with regular updates and reminders.
- All teachers and staff know precisely how to identify and report concerns.
- Child protection files are kept by the DSL.
- The Headteacher follows missing from education guidance.
- All new staff complete safeguarding inductions.
- We have a designated teacher for Looked After Children.
- All visitors are signed in and wear lanyards so the children know they are safe to be in school.

Attendance

- Mrs Bartle is the lead on attendance. She monitors this weekly and follows our attendance policy to support pupils and families with attendance below 90% and those struggling to get to school on time.
- Meetings are booked where the aim is to identify any problems and difficulties in order to offer help and solutions to ensure that children attend school.
- The school operates a first day response system.

Pupil Voice

Pupils are actively encouraged to speak about any concerns they have to a member of staff. In lessons children are taught to speak openly about their emotions. Pupils know that staff take all concerns very seriously.

Mental Health	CAMHS If staff or parents have concerns regarding a child's mental health a referral can be made to CAMHS service.
	Reach4well being The Reach4Wellbeing team aims to promote positive wellbeing, reach children and young people in their communities and reduce the stigma of mental health. They currently provide short-term group programmes for children and young people age 5-18 experiencing mild to moderate anxiety and low mood. Parents and staff can refer individual children to the NHS Reach4well being to support anxiety. If required, school will attempt to provide a room to allow sessions to take place.
