Over the next term we will be learning all about Italy. For this project homework we would like you to get creative! We would like you to make something relating to Italy. This may be baking some Italian cuisine or creating a model of a volcano, landmark, or other feature of Italy. If you would like to do a baking project you may bring in a sample or you could just take pictures of the finished product!

Alongside your model/creation we would like a piece of writing. This may be any of the following:

- Instructions of how you made it (accompanying pictures of the process would be exciting to see)!
- Explanation of exciting features
- Informative paragraph about what you now know about your feature.

Parents - We believe this task is accessible by children working at all ability levels. Please let them complete the project at a level that is appropriate for them. This is important as we want them to know and understand the information they are sharing. From the most accessible – “Rome has a very old colosseum.” – to the more challenging – “Did you know the colosseum is an oval amphitheatre that has been standing in Rome since its first construction in 80AD?”

Some ideas:

- Model of Mt. Etna or Mt Vesuvius erupting
- Baking- Italian pizza, pasta dish, bread
- Model of the leaning tower of Pisa, the colosseum, Venice, Trevi Fountain, Pompeii ruins
- The Alps
- Lake Garda
- Dolomites

We look forward to seeing your finished projects on **Friday 15th May**. The children will be given an opportunity to share their projects with the rest of their class.
