



Dear Parents/Guardians,

In school we are enjoying our cross curricular project on World War II. Much of the of the learning will focus on the lives of children in war and being evacuated. Children will compare what they learn to their own lives.

We would like to ask the children to imagine that they are a child living in a town or city and they have not been evacuated to the countryside imagining they have stayed in a city under the Blitz. We would like them to produce a war time scrapbook of their 'experiences'.

Here are a few ideas to get you started:

- Diary entries - We are sharing a fictional wartime diary and writing some dairy entries in school.
- Sketches of what they can see
- War time poems/songs
- Descriptions of war time games
- Recipes/ rations (weighing) / meals eaten
- Description/drawing of your air raid shelter
- Your typical day (with times)
- Data handling (number of air raid warnings on each day of the week etc)

Plus...anything else you can think of!

On this occasion we are not asking for model making as we are constructing Anderson shelters in school in DT. Amongst all of the drawings and ideas please make sure to include some writing, that is the children's ideas and wording, even if supported in its production and spelling.

The children have 7 weeks to complete this project and their finished work should reflect this. We suggest they spend some time working on it each week to ensure it is finished on time. We expect all children to complete a home learning project. Thank you for your support with this.

We would like you to bring your finished projects into school on Monday 11th November. The children will have the opportunity to see each other's finished projects in the classrooms.
